Established in 1995 as a standing committee of the Washington Supreme Court's Access to Justice Board, the EJC is our state's non-partisan, grassroots advocacy effort working to protect and increase public funding for civil legal aid.

Our primary focus is state funding for legal aid, but we also advocate at the federal and local levels. We mobilize legal aid providers, attorneys, judges, and supporters from around the state to speak as a unified voice, promoting justice for all.
